Children's Fair Held

SKS Foundation organized a Shishu Mela (Children's Fair) on 20 November 2022 at the premises of Komolpur Govt. Primary School of Ghuridah union under Saghata, Gaibandha. Under the Championing Play Project supported by Save the Children, 40 pre-primary school children attended the Fair with their mothers playing together. They watched videos, took pictures, shared kid stories, played puzzles, and had health check-ups at the Fair.

Sardar Mustafa Shahin, UNO, Saghata, inaugurated the day-long Fair themed "Learning through Play" as the Chief Guest. Rafiqul Islam, Upazila Primary Education Officer, Saghata was the Special Guest with A.F.M. Najnin Sultana, Headmistress, Komolpur Government Primary School in the chair. They pointed out that children like and enjoy playing over conventional teaching. And mother is the main teacher for grooming children's lives. So, every mother needs to learn how to teach her children through playing. Playing makes children joyful and keeps them away from anxiety. Anxiety is harmful to children's future development. Around 300 people mostly women from surrounding areas gathered and enjoyed the Fair.

Daughters & Mothers-in-law Fair Held

Md. Anisur Rahman, Upazila Nirbahi Officer, Fulchari, inaugurated the Fair as the Chief Guest. Md. Zakirul Islam, Upazila Family Planning Officer, Fulchari attended the Fair as a special guest while Golam Mostafa Kamal Pasha, Chairman, Uria union, chaired the Event.

The discussants in the Fair upheld, since mothers-in-law play an important role in decision-making in the family, particularly in the care of pregnant mothers and baby delivery, the importance of mutual understanding between daughters-in-law and mothers-in-law to realize the special need of each other. Pregnant daughters-in-law and their unborn babies need special care which can be given by their mothers-in-law by feeding well and behaving well with their daughters-in-law to seek healthy babies as the babies' mental, physical, and social health depend on their mothers' health. And for safe delivery, all mothers-in-law need to take their pregnant daughters-in-law to the hospital. Contrary, the daughters-in-law need to take good care of the mothers-in-law.

Among others, Mohammad Matlubar Rahman, Headmaster, Gunvhori Di-Mukhi High School, Baharam Khan, Project Coordinator, the Promotion of Maternal, and Newborn Health (MAMOTA) Project, spoke at the Fair. Around 500 people flocked to the Daughters & Mothers-in-law's Fair. The Fair was organized under SKS' MAMOTA project with support from Save the Children, KOICA, and the Health Department of the Government of Bangladesh.

Project Inception Workshop Held

With the aim of sustainable improvement of livelihoods and living conditions of flood-affected communities of Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila, SKS Foundation launched the Expanded Livelihoods for 2000 Poor Households and Increased Resilience to Flooding in Lalmonirhat. The Inception Workshop was organized at Upazila Parishad Hall on 22 December 2022.

And the proper education and nurturing which is given by a mother can play a big role to lessen the violence against women. The discussion also focused that the constant flood and river erosion in Gaibandha is damaging the existing WASH facilities which are leading people to unsafe WASH habits. And the situation gets worst during floods when women and children become vulnerable to safety regarding their WASH and healthcare. So, resilient WASH and healthcare facilities especially for women and children should get top priority.

Training of *Char-based* Agro Input Traders Held



SKS Foundation organized a Training for *Char-based* Agro Input Traders to promote the agricultural products of the *char* farmers. Fifteen Agro Input Retailers from *char*-prevailed unions of Saghata, Fulchari, Sundarganj, and Gaibandha Sadar attended the Course. Alongside, representatives of Agro Input Companies and Micro-finance Institutions joined the Training. The day-long Training was held on 28 November 2022 at SKS Inn, Gaibandha.

Inaugurating the Training, Md. Belal Uddin, DD, District Agricultural Extension Department, said, "In the global recession, the Government is trying to increase the agricultural productivity to avoid food shortage. The Government is supporting the farmers with agricultural materials and materials available. So, no one should make an excuse for the shortfall and increased price."

Avijit Kumar Roy, Sr. Consultant, Swisscontact said, "Making Markets Works for the Chars (M4C) project is supporting the char farmers to improve their agricultural productivity so that they can have better lives & livelihoods." Aminul Islam, an Agricultural Input Retailer & Trader said, "Every business turns into profitable in making relation. Being a Retailer, I will help the clients, and they will help me to grow my business. It's like a win-win situation."

The day-long Course covered the cultivation process of seasonal crop rotation, seed selection, pesticide control, finance sources for *char* farmers and retailers, etc. Md. Hafizur Rahman Sekh, Intervention Specialist, M4C, SKS Foundation conducted the Training.

Marking the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-based Violence, SKS Foundation organized a dialogue on WASH & Healthcare for Women & Child Protection on 8 December 2022 at SKS Inn, Gaibandha. Centering this year's theme, 'Build unity among all, stop violence against women and children, the local government, non-government officials, elected representatives, journalists, community leaders, and women and girl leaders attended the Dialogue.

Dr. Md. Abdullahel Mafi, Civil Surgeon, Gaibandha, graced the Dialogue as the Chief Guest, and Nargis Jahan, DD, Department of Women Affairs, was the Special Guest with Joseph Halder, Director-Advocacy & Communication, SKS Foundation in the chair.



The Chief Guest said, "Women and children are being tortured physically and mentally everywhere. It's happening not only for financial scarcity but also for our negative mentality. So, we need to change our negative mindset toward women and children. Alongside, we need to acknowledge women's needs in their WASH and healthcare. Unfortunately, women's special needs, particularly in WASH facilities, are not recognized. We hardly notice separate WASH facilities in public places, and somewhere the WASH facilities are set far away, and unhygienic that barring women & children to access those facilities. To solve this, we all, GOs, NGOs, civil society, media & community, need coordinated action."

Special Guest said, "Negligence toward women begins from the womb as baby girls are not desired in a patriarchal society. The girls then grow up with negligence in their father's house and later in their in-laws' house. So, they are neglected everywhere. The problem lies in our society and our thinking. Marrying off girls at a young age means killing her dream. For overcoming this, a baby girl should be accepted and nurtured rather than thinking of marrying off."

Centering the observance of International Human Rights Day, the Award was given to Umme Habiba and other 6 on 8 December 2022 in a ceremony at the auditorium of the Muktijuddho Jadughor (Liberation War Museum) in Dhaka. Gwyn Lewis, Resident Coordinator, UN, Ms. Gitanjali Singh, Country Representative, UN Women Bangladesh, and Ms. Kristine Blokhus, Country Representative, UNFPA in Bangladesh, handed over the Padak.

Umme Habiba appeared in the HSC examination in 2022. Being a program participant of SKS Foundation, she has been engaged in preventing child marriage through the *Action for Socio-economic Security & Rights for Excluded and Marginalized Women & Girls* Project since 2019. Habiba found that many of her classmates got married and some were prepared to marry off centering the COVID-19 pandemic. Habiba convinced the parents and brought many of them back to school providing books to continue their studies. Thus, Umme Habiba prevented 10 child marriages and managed 18 married classmates to get back to school.
