Due to price hike of essential goods, many low-income families struggle to afford nutritious meals during Ramadan, particularly for *Iftar & Sahri*. Recognizing this, SKS Foundation and Muslim Aid jointly provided food packages to the deserving families.

#### Water Crisis Deepens with Climate Change

(from page 4) To mark World Water Day 2024, FANSA- Bangladesh of which SKS Foundation is the Secretariat organized the webinar. Aligned with World Water Day 2024 theme, '*Water for Peace*', the event emphasized the significance of water in fostering global stability and prosperity. Dr. Atiq Rahman, Executive Director of BCAS chaired the event. Dr. Md. Mujibur Rahman, Professor of Civil Engineering, United International University (UIU), and Ex-Professor & Head of Civil Engineering, BUET & Ex-Director of ITN-BUET, presented the keynote, followed by a panel discussion with specialists & professionals in the field of water & climate change who upheld their valued insights concerning water governance, integrity to end water poverty & instability. Around 100 professionals joined the webinar across Bangladesh.

The keynote stated that over 2 billion people lack access to safe drinking water. Nearly half of the world's population experiences water scarcity and 80% of wastewater flows untreated, further jeopardizing water quality. Crisscrossed by rivers, Bangladesh faces a water paradox. Millions lack access to safe drinking water due to a confluence of challenges. Contamination is a major culprit: arsenic lurks in groundwater, poisoning wells. Rising sea levels push saltwater inland, tainting coastal freshwater supplies. Declining river flows and diminished rainfall, fueled by climate change, further strain resources. Over-extraction of groundwater resources depletes reserves, while untreated industrial and domestic wastewater further contaminates freshwater sources.

The event highlighted the need for improved data collection and monitoring systems for informed decision-making. The event recommended investment in research, education, public awareness of water conservation, and increasing cooperation and collaboration on water management strategies at local, national, regional, and international levels is a must for ensuring water security & safety.

### Annual Sports & Cultural Program Held

The rally started and ended at the school premises, wherein began the discussion. She said, "Fazlupur is a river-racked area wherein the people are not advanced, let alone the women. So, we need to work more to uplift women in *chars*; for this, women must react first to claim their rights."

(from page 4) The day-long meeting focused on critical issues i.e. existing sanitation facilities in public spaces are not women-friendly, absence of separate female toilets is hindering women's mobility, etc. The Meeting emphasized the importance of collaborative efforts to elevate sanitation standards in Gaibandha. The members agreed to develop a concrete action plan tailored to the specific needs of each ward.

The Women's Forum decided to advocate for the municipality to allocate a designated budget for the city's sanitation system in its upcoming financial year. Additionally, ward representatives formulated individual action plans aimed at demanding improvements of sanitation systems, waste management practices, and the consistent flow of water for drinking & toilet facilities.

To dip into the deep, the delegation also had meeting the with community people comprised of Village Savings and Loan Association (VSLA), Flood Preparedness Program Volunteers, Girls Forum, and Farmers Group at One Stop Service Center located in Akotabazar village of Belka Union of Sundarganj Upazila. Alongside, the delegation observed plinth raising, production of organic fertilizer, and Farmer Field Business School's activities in South Ghagoa village, Ghagoa union of Gaibandha Sadar upazila. Later, the delegation had a view exchange meeting with the projects and senior officials of SKS Foundation at its Head Office, Gaibandha and emphasized on the sustainability of the progress.

# Bangladesh Makes Strides in Sanitation, More Investment Needed

A review of Bangladesh's progress in implementing the commitments of the 7<sup>th</sup> South Asian Conference on Sanitation (SACOSAN) highlighted both success & challenges in the country's sanitation efforts. The review found significant progress in open defecation reduction, policy formulation, and data collection on sanitation. However, challenges are remaining particularly in remote areas and with regards to building a safely managed sanitation.

On 28 February 2024, the reflection came up in a Webinar, organized by the FANSA-Bangladesh secretariat- SKS Foundation. Engr. Tushar Mohon Shadhu Khan, Additional Chief Engineer (Planning), Department of Public Health Engineering (DPHE) graced the Webinar as the Guest of Honor. Dr. Tanvir Ahmed, Professor, Civil Engineering Dept. & Director, ITN-BUET presented the sanitation status in line with 7<sup>th</sup> SACOSAN Commitments. The Webinar was joined by WASH specialists, professionals and representatives from FANSA-BD member organizations across the country.



The WASH professionals joined the 7<sup>th</sup> SACOSAN progress review Webinar.

The review noted that 79% of the WASH budget is allocated to urban areas, while only 21% goes to rural areas. Despite the fact, rural areas have played a larger role in the overall progress in sanitation promotion.

Speakers emphasized the importance of continued collaboration between the government and private sector to address the challenges. This will help ensure that water and sanitation issues receive the priority they deserve in Bangladesh's development agenda. They pointed out that more extensive investment is needed to achieve the SDG-6.
